Kaiaka (merit) **M**

Kairangi (excellence) **E**

If you do not meet the requirements for a standard you will receive “not achieved” (N).

There will be more than one assessment opportunity for AS 1.1, 1.2 and 1.3 **NOTE: In order to be able to resubmit your speech you must first submit it on the due date.**

The focus of this course is to further increase your understanding of the language and to enable you to express yourself in a variety of genre or writing styles. These genre are:

1. Mihimihi
2. Narrative (story telling)
3. Dialogue
4. Reports/reviews
5. Descriptive language
7. Instructions and directions

The contexts in which you will develop these skills continue to be based on your daily life experiences eg whanau, kainga, kura, taone, marae.
